Yesterday Jason and Erika were hot.

Yesterday the man gave me a cup, and I took the cup.

You had three carrots yesterday.

Yesterday Bryce had two shoes.

Today is Thursday, so yesterday was Wednesday.

The dog and the cat were hot yesterday.

Yesterday we were hot.

Yesterday Marco took off his hat.

The teachers gave me a pencil yesterday.

Yesterday they put on two pairs of socks.

The girl had a piece of cake yesterday.

Put on Clothing and Past Tense

Today is Tuesday, and today Ashley eats cake.

Yesterday was Monday, and yesterday she ate a carrot.

Jason and Erika put on their coats.

They are hot, so they take off their coats.

So, they put their coats on, and they took them off.

Yesterday you gave me a pair of shoes.

You had a pair of shoes, but now I have a pair of shoes.

I put the shoes on.

Yesterday was hot, so Izzy took off her scarf.

Now she puts on her scarf.

Yesterday Bryce put a hat on his head

Yesterday he put a hat on.

Now he takes the hat off of his head.

He takes the hat off.

Marco has sunglasses.

Yesterday was hot, so Alan gave Marco sunglasses.

Marco took the sunglasses yesterday and put them on.
